INFORMATION FOR OWNERS & TRAINERS

BADGE ALLOCATION:

Every owner, partnership and syndicate is entitled to six owners' badges with lunch per runner. Registered syndicates may have up to twelve badges in exchange for lunch.

We ask that the syndicate manager agrees the allocation of badges under their management in advance of the meeting. Please be reminded that it is the responsibility of the syndicate or partnership manager to inform their owners of our dress code and specific lunch arrangements made on their behalf and in advance.

Trainers with runners on the day and jockeys with a ride will be entitled to two enclosure badges each. Owners of horses that are entered but not declared, can be offered two Richmond Enclosure badges for that day.

BADGE COLLECTION:

Badges can only be collected from the Owners & Trainers' desk at the Richmond Enclosure entrance close to Car Park 6.

Please present your PASS card or QR code confirmation from the PASS system. We reserve the right to ask for ID before any badges are released.

Please pre-book all your badge requirements, by no later than 11pm the day before via rcapass.com, telephone 01933 270333, or email pass@weatherbys.co.uk.

Please understand we will not always be able to accommodate late requests after this time.

Due to frequent sell out at Three Friday Nights, owner and trainers are eligible to receive four complimentary tickets only for attendees under 18 for these fixtures.

The Owners & Trainers' Pavilion

Situated to the right of the Parade Ring, it is an exclusive bar offering complimentary tea and coffee throughout the day and plays host to our raceday winning connections.

Exclusive Seated Viewing

An owners & trainers' exclusive seated viewing area can be found at the front of the March Grandstand just below the Duke of Richmond's Box. Accessible viewing is available on request from the members' bar via the internal lift in the March Grandstand, or from elevated platforms on the rails just past the finishing line.

The Horsewalk – Syndicate and Annual Members' Lounge

The Horsewalk has been transformed into a bespoke syndicate and annual members' lounge. Racegoers can enjoy a bar and complimentary tea and coffee to accompany the perfect backdrop for all racing enthusiasts.

Please can we ask that gazebos are not erected in such a way that they block other car parking spaces. If spaces become too limited, we reserve the right to request they are taken down.

DRESS CODE

At Goodwood we embrace quintessentially British style – whether that's high fashion or something more classic, it's about a relaxed yet chic look. We are known for a distinctive style – linen suits, Panama hats and chic dresses are de-rigueur. Ever since King Edward VII relaxed the dresscode in the 19th century, we have enjoyed a carefree holiday feel here, unlike any other racecourse.

Within the Richmond Enclosure

Gentlemen (and boys aged 16 and over) are required to wear a jacket, collared shirt and a tie to all 19 racedays. Women should wear smart attire, suitable for a day at the races. For the warmer fixtures think summer garden-party: a floaty, floral dress, or an elegant top and trouser/skirt combination. For the cooler racedays, dress for the



weather by layering up. A tweed jacket paired with boots is the perfect combination to keep you warm.

Children should also dress in smart attire. Boys aged 7-15 years are asked to wear a long sleeved collared shirt (no polo shirts). The dress code is not applicable to children under 7 years.

CHILDREN

Children under 12 years of age will not be allowed access to the Parade Ring. Children between the ages of 12-16 must be accompanied by an adult.

WINNING CONNECTIONS

Owners of winning horses will be presented with a trophy, a video in a card of the race, and a memory stick of images. They will also receive a celebratory glass of English Sparkling Wine in the pavilion, with our owners & trainers' representative.

SPRING RACING

SEASON OPENER

Friday 1 – Saturday 2 May

The feature races of the Season Opener are devoted to fillies and mares, with two Listed contests restricted exclusively to them. Across both days, the programme is complemented by a series of valuable handicaps and maidens, which regularly attract competitive and informative fields as the season begins to take shape.

The Listed EBF Daisy Warwick Stakes, run over a mile and four furlongs, takes place on the Friday and has produced numerous high-class winners such as the outstanding Alpinista, who was successful in 2021 before going on to claim Europe's premier middle-distance prize in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. In 2025, the race was won by Shaha, trained by John and Thady Gosden.

Saturday's feature is the Listed Conqueror Stakes, run over a mile for fillies and mares aged three and upwards. The 2025 renewal went the way of Wathnan Racing's Crimson Advocate, who went on to advertise the strength of the form when striking at Royal Ascot in the Group 2 Duke of Cambridge Stakes.

MAY FESTIVAL

Friday 22 – Saturday 23 May

This year's May Festival features three Listed contests, the Height of Fashion Stakes, the EBF Cocked Hat Stakes and the Festival Stakes, each benefiting from increased prize money for the new season, a theme that runs throughout the 2026 Goodwood racing programme.

Friday hosts the Festival Stakes, run over one mile and two furlongs and now worth £70,000. Multiple Group 1 winner Decorated Knight is the standout name on the Festival Stakes roll of honour, underlining the quality the race can produce. King Of Conquest was also a notable winner in 2023, finishing strongly before going on to perform consistently in Group company later in the season.

Saturday's card features both the Height of Fashion Stakes and the EBF Cocked Hat Stakes, each now run for £70,000. The former is contested over one mile and two furlongs and has produced high-class fillies, including Sea Silk Road, who went on to become a Group 1 winner.

The Cocked Hat Stakes has long been regarded as an informative trial for the major middle-distance Classics. Amiloc landed the 2025 renewal for Ralph Beckett and being a gelding, was unable to take up an entry in the Derby. Instead, he went on to claim the Group 2 King Edward VII Stakes at Royal Ascot and later finished runner-up in the Group 1 Irish St Leger. The 2024 winner Meydaan has also gone on to make his mark at Group level both domestically and on the global stage.

JUNE RACING

FAMILY RACE DAY

Sunday 7 June

Family Race Day features a competitive and valuable afternoon of racing, highlighted by two £70,000 Listed contests.

Run over one mile and four furlongs, the Tapster Stakes regularly attracts high-quality middle-distance performers. Last year's renewal was won by the hugely popular Hamish, a modern-day Goodwood favourite who has provided so much joy for connections during a distinguished career. The horse was bred and owned by the late father of trainer William Haggas and has been closely associated with Maureen Haggas, assistant trainer to her husband William, who has long been involved in riding the horse in his work at home.

The Listed Agnes Keyser Stakes provides a further boost to the day's programme. Open to fillies and contested over one mile and two furlongs, the race was won last year by Waardah, trained by Owen Burrows. Originally run at Newbury Racecourse, the contest moved to Goodwood in 2023 and has quickly established itself as an important opportunity for progressive middle-distance fillies.

THREE FRIDAY NIGHTS

Friday 5, 12 & 19 June

Three Friday Nights hosts a series of unforgettable evenings of racing and entertainment across June, with fixtures taking place on Friday 5, Friday 12 and Friday 19 June.

The opening fixture on Friday 5 June features a six-race card exclusively for apprentice jockeys, with a points-based system used to crown the leading rider of the evening. Last year Joe Leavy claimed the Leading Apprentice award, while Tyrese Cameron was recognised with the Performance of the Evening award.

The following two Friday fixtures on 12 and 19 June feature competitive six-race cards, with a strong blend of handicaps and valuable maiden contests contributing to the action on the racecourse. Prize money across the two cards has increased by more than £40,000 this season, part of a wider theme of rising prize money across Goodwood's 2026 racing programme. The racing provides a fitting backdrop to the post-racing entertainment that makes Three Friday Nights such a popular highlight of the summer calendar.

SUMMER RACING

QATAR GOODWOOD FESTIVAL PRESENTED BY VISIT QATAR Tuesday 28 July – Saturday 1 August

Affectionately known as ‘Glorious Goodwood’, the Qatar Goodwood Festival returns this year from 28 July to 1 August. The eyes of the racing world will once again turn to the South Downs for our annual showpiece of world-class racing and glamour, set against one of the sport’s most iconic backdrops.

We are grateful to our valued sponsors, both new and longstanding, for their continued support in helping make the festival such a memorable occasion. In particular, we thank our title partner, Visit Qatar, for their continued support.

Last year’s festival produced a series of memorable performances. Scandinavia landed the opening day’s feature The Group 1 Qatar Goodwood Cup staying contest for Aidan O’Brien before going on to Classic success later in the season when capturing the Group 1 St Leger.

Wednesday’s Group 1 Visit Qatar Sussex Stakes produced a shock result when Juddmonte’s Qirat made all to claim the famous mile prize with a bold front-running performance.

The Group 1 Qatar Nassau Stakes was run in testing conditions following a dramatic downpour that turned the ground heavy, but Aidan O’Brien’s Whirl proved equal to the task to secure further Group 1 honours in the feature contest for fillies and mares.

Day four features the blistering five-furlong Group 2 King George Qatar Stakes, a race synonymous with the brilliant sprinter Battaash. Last year JM Jungle prevailed in a dramatic renewal as the field split into two groups.

The festival concludes with the cavalry charge of the Coral Stewards’ Cup. The famous six-furlong handicap was won in 2025 by Two Tribesa, a rewarding success for Phil Cunningham’s Rebel Racing.

AUGUST BANK HOLIDAY

Friday 28 – Sunday 30 August

The three-day August Bank Holiday fixture combines high-quality racing with a relaxed summer atmosphere on the Sussex Downs. From a spectacular fireworks display following racing on Friday evening to a host of family activities across the weekend, the meeting evokes the spirit of the traditional British summer holiday.

Across the three days, £828,000 in prize money is on offer, providing a strong programme of competitive racing.

Saturday's card is headlined by the prestigious Group 2 Celebration Mile, a race that has often served as a springboard for top-class milers. Previous winners include Lightning Spear, who later went on to claim the Sussex Stakes at this very track. Last year's renewal went to French Guineas runner-up Jonquil, who delivered victory for Andrew Balding and Juddmonte.

The £100,000 Group 3 Prestige Stakes provides an important test for juvenile fillies. Last year's renewal was won by Precise for Aidan O'Brien, a filly who subsequently advertised her quality with victories at Group 1 level.

AUTUMN RACING

AUTUMN RACING

Tuesday 8 September

Set against the seasonally coloured Sussex countryside, this late-season fixture offers a competitive afternoon of racing on the Downs and a welcome midweek opportunity to experience Goodwood in a more relaxed setting.

Tuesday's seven-race card is worth more than £133,000 in prize money. A Class 2 Conditions race over one mile for two-year-olds provides an attractive late-season opportunity for promising juveniles, while a Class 2 Handicap over two miles adds further depth to the programme.

The staying handicap has regularly attracted progressive middle-distance performers as well as smart dual-purpose horses, ensuring a competitive contest to complement the afternoon's racing.

AUTUMN RACING

Wednesday 23 September

- To engage with partners, suppliers, fans and members to become more sustainable through Goodwood demonstrating leadership.



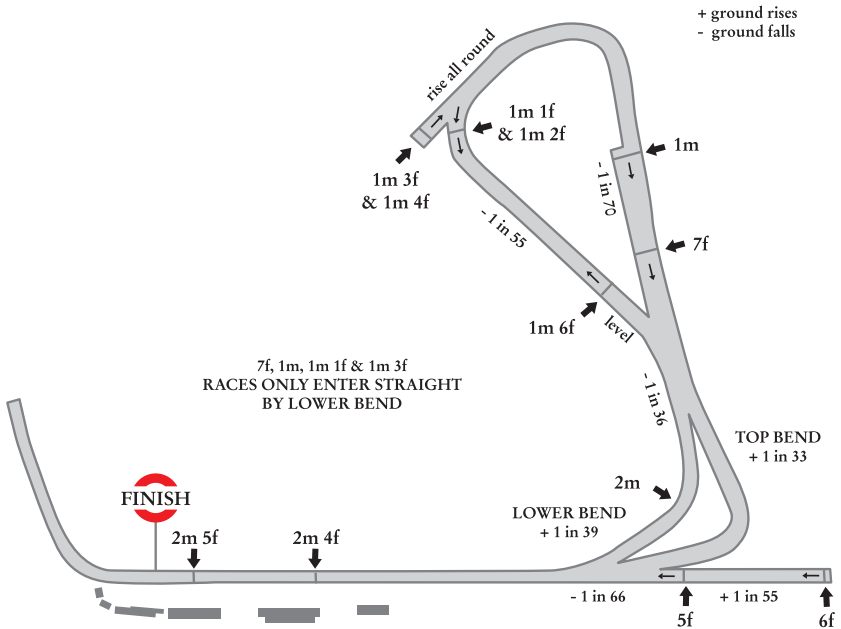

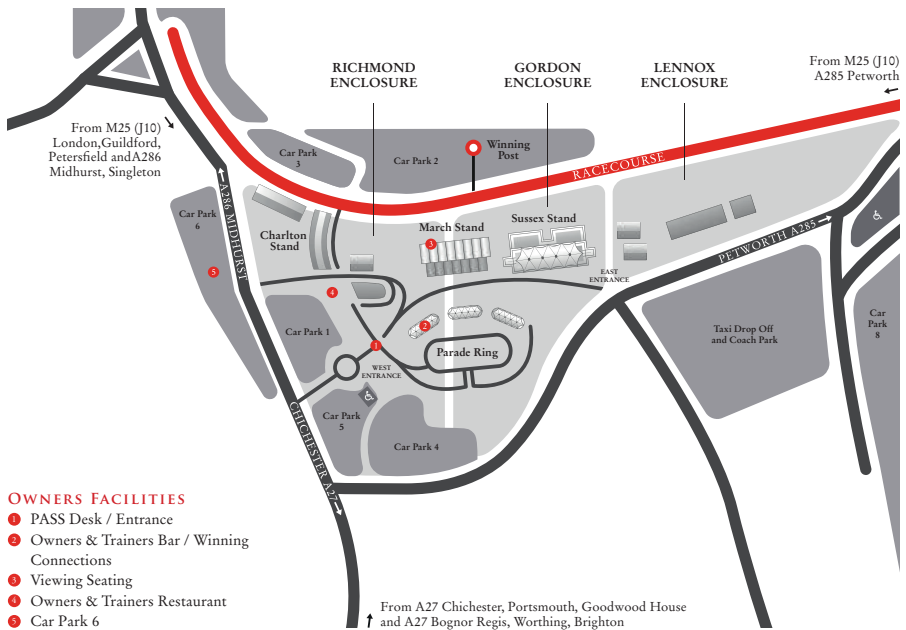
THE COURSE
